Intentional rounding is a structured approach whereby nurses conduct checks on patients at set times to assess and manage their fundamental care needs. Concerns about poor standards of basic nursing care have refocused attention on the need to ensure fundamental aspects of care are delivered reliably.

Intentional rounding: a review of the literature - RCNi

Intentional Rounding was created as a way to prevent harm like falls, hospital acquired pressure ulcers, and hospital acquired infections (Studer Group, 2007). Furthermore, Intentional Rounding is a way to enhance the patient experience (Studer Group, 2007).

Emerging Technologies in Nursing Care: Intentional Rounding

This QI project involved collaboration of physicians (both internal medicine residents and attendings) and nurses from four general medicine services on one 36-bed nursing unit of Mayo Clinic Hospital – Saint Mary’s Campus, Rochester, MN. Each general medicine service comprises three interns, one senior resident, and one attending physician.

Kaizen, or continuous improvement, means adjusting how healthcare organizations operate to create value. Many hospitals have been applying Lean, such as Virginia Mason Medical Center, ThedaCare, Mayo Clinic, and Seattle Children's Hospital (Toussaint & Berry, 2013).

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
